The Reform Club was founded in 1836, in Pall Mall, in the centre of what is often called London's Clubland. The founders commissioned a leading architect of the day, Charles Barry, to build an imposing and palatial clubhouse. It is as splendid today as when it opened in 1841.

THURSDAY 29 JANUARY Check into the Cavendish Hotel from 3 pm, early welcome drink and those that wish can book the Cavendish pre-theatre dinner or dine locally. Taxis will take you to the Savoy Theatre in the Strand for the evening performance of **Dirty Rotten Scoundrels**.

Spectacular Coastal Scenery, Historic Houses, Spring Gardens and Cornish villages, the Fal River

These magical Cornish gardens are home to the most exciting, rare and beautiful plants and trees in the British Isles. Cornwall looks superb in May, a peak time to visit the gardens and a chance also to see wonderful coastal scenery and some historic houses. Stay for four nights with harbour view rooms at the popular Greenbank Hotel in Falmouth, and enjoy dining in its excellent restaurant overlooking the river.

Included in the itinerary – **Trenwainton** where the spirit of the plant hunters lives on in breath-taking spring displays of magnolias, rhododendrons and camellias. The coastal cliff gardens at **Chygurno** and the **Minack Theatre** where the south east aspect shelters them from the storms, but offers superb views and a stunning blend of exotic plants and native species. Take the boat from Falmouth to St Mawes to visit **Lomorran** with its wonderful views and Mediterranean planting. A visit to the elegant 18th century **Trewithen House** surrounded by the loveliest woodland garden with rare blooms and magical glades.

In the spring **Tregrehan** is a magnificent garden with towering specimen trees planted in the late 19th century and a renowned collection of camellias. **Pinetum Park and Pine Lodge Garden** is a remarkable garden with seeds and plants collected from all over the world. **Trelissick House** has recently opened and contains many of the original contents bought at auction by the National Trust. It is a wonderful garden with superb views at the head of the River Fal. Finally two beautiful valley gardens to choose from – **Glendurgan**, set in a wooded valley above the Helford estuary, or **Trebah**, a sub-tropical paradise with a stunning coastal backdrop.

MONDAY 11 MAY Check into the hotel before welcome drink and dinner.

TUESDAY 12 MAY Tregrehan with a guided tour and refreshments. Pine Lodge garden visit with light lunch and Trewithen House and garden.

WEDNESDAY 13 MAY Boat from Falmouth to St Mawes. Garden visit to Lomorran with time for lunch in St Mawes. Trelissick in the afternoon – there is an option to return by boat from the garden back to Falmouth instead of the coach.

THURSDAY 14 MAY Heading for Land's End. In Penzance, a visit to Penlee House and Gallery, continuing to Chygurno and then to the Minack Theatre where lunch can be purchased in their café. Afternoon visit to Trenwainton.

FRIDAY 15 MAY Choose to enjoy the gardens at Glendurgan or Trebah before the coach returns to the hotel and Truro station for 1 pm.



Travel by Eurostar London to Lille to discover the great art galleries of Northern France; staying at the **Carlton Hotel**, a beautiful 19th century building situated in the heart of the old part of the city next to the Grand Place and surrounded by beautiful Flemish style buildings. There will be a visit to the new **Louvre-Lens**, an annex of the Louvre in Paris, a modern state of the art building that houses exhibits on loan from the Louvre. Lille's fine art museum is the **Palais des Beaux-Arts**, a splendid Belle Époque building dating from the late 1890s with a suitably illustrious art collection and superb sculpture galleries; there will be a tour of the highlights.

La Piscine - Musée d'Art et d'Industrie in Roubaix; as interesting for the building as for its exhibits, the museum is a former art deco 1930's swimming pool remodelled as a museum. It contains an unusual collection of statues, paintings, ceramics and textiles.

The Château de Beloeil is a stately home that began life as a medieval fortress but over the centuries has been transformed into a country home with a magnificent 17th century Baroque garden. The art collection and library containing many rare books were saved from a fire in the original house. The Château hosts an **Amaryllis Festival** with beautiful displays of some 5000 flowers in the main rooms. A tour of the house before lunch and then a land train can transport you around the landscaped gardens. **Ypres** is so close to Lille that an afternoon will be spent at the **In Flanders Fields Museum** located in the Cloth Hall in the centre, then early dinner in the town before walking to the **Menin Gate** for the simple but very moving **Last Post Ceremony**.

TUESDAY 28 APRIL Visit **Chateau de Beloeil** stopping en route in the attractive town of **Tournai**. Guided tour, lunch and enjoy the gardens before continuing to **Musee La Piscine**. Return to Lille, dine independently or join others.

WEDNESDAY 29 APRIL Walk the short distance to **Palais des Beaux-Arts** for a tour of the highlights; time in Lille for lunch. Depart early afternoon for Ypres. A visit to **In Flanders Fields Museum**, early dinner in local restaurant before the **Last Post Ceremony**. Return to Lille around 10 pm.

THURSDAY 30 APRIL Depart hotel for **Louvre-Lens** – museum visit with behind the scenes tour. Return to Lille for the 15.36 Eurostar to London arriving 16.05.

A tour staying in the heart of the New Forest at the **Rhinefield House Hotel**, an historic house and magnificent country mansion with landscaped gardens, ornamental waterways, extensive grounds and woodland.

There will be visits to **Breamore House**, an Elizabethan manor house noted for its fine collection of paintings and furniture. The grandeur of the house has changed little over the past 400 years but it still remains a family home. **Salisbury Cathedral** has the finest of the four original surviving copies of Magna Carta. The 800th anniversary celebrations will re-display and re-present its Magna Carta in an exciting interactive exhibition in the newly-conserved Chapter House. An opportunity to discover the history of the unique 18th century shipbuilding village at **Bucklers Hard** and the **Maritime Museum** followed by a visit to **21 Chestnut Road**, a small garden in Brockenhurst - a plant lover's dream, of colour, form and scent.

Portsmouth. A unique chance to see the famous map room at **Southwick House** used during the invasion of Europe when the house became the headquarters of the main allied commanders; one of the most momentous decisions of the Second World War was taken in the old library in June 1944. An afternoon visit to **The Overlord Embroidery**; inspired by the Bayeux Tapestry and the centrepiece of the **D-Day Museum**, it traces in stunning visual form the progress of Overlord from its origins in 1940 to victory in Normandy in 1944. Supper at Brasserie Blanc in Gunwharf Quays before an "after-hours" **private visit and guided tour** of the new £27 million **Mary Rose Museum**. The Mary Rose, Britain's great Tudor warship which captured the world's imagination when she was raised from the seabed in 1982, is now the centrepiece of this stunning new museum built around her, reuniting the ship with its contents and crew.

The tour starts on **MONDAY 18 MAY** at Carlisle Station (departing by 3.30 pm) where a coach takes you into the heart of Galloway to stay at the luxury **Cally Palace Hotel**. The elegant Cally Palace Hotel, formerly a beautiful 18th century mansion at Gatehouse of Fleet, offers period style rooms combined with the modern comforts of a four star hotel. It stands in its own grounds of 600 acres with an 18 hole golf course, leisure centre and indoor pool.

The itinerary includes a wealth of stunning gardens nurtured by the exceptionally mild climate from the warm Gulf Stream on the Stranraer peninsula – **Castle Kennedy**, **Logan Botanical Garden** and **Glenwhan**. A guided tour of **Drumlanrig Castle** with its iconic art collection and priceless furniture and an exclusive visit to **Dabton**, the private garden of the Duke and Duchess of Buccleuch. A visit to **Threave House**, a garden recently given the accolade of one of the top ten in the UK to see; also **Broughton House**, former home of Scottish painter E A Hornel, one of the Glasgow Boys, and the beautiful garden at **Corsock** north of Dumfries.

TUESDAY 19 MAY **Glenwhan Garden**, filled with glorious collections of plants and magnificent views over Luce Bay, the Mull of Galloway and the Isle of Man. **Logan Botanic Garden** is unrivalled as the country's most exotic garden, a remarkable collection of the bizarre and beautiful thriving in subtropical conditions.

Castle Kennedy Gardens, Scotland's best-known historical gardens, surrounded by water and romantically sited on an isthmus between two natural lochs, have rare and exotic plants, superb rhododendrons, azaleas and camellias.

WEDNESDAY 20 MAY Guided tour of **Drumlanrig Castle**, the 17th century Renaissance home of the Duke of Buccleuch followed by a visit to the Duke and Duchess's private garden at nearby **Dabton**. The extensive walled garden, borders, flowering shrubs, azaleas and primulas should be at their best in May.

THURSDAY 21 MAY **Threave House**, a restored Scottish baronial-style house with landscaped gardens and themed 'rooms'. Lunch available in the restaurant before continuing to **Corsock House**, a much loved family garden with glades of woodland, exotic shrubs and huge rhododendrons.

FRIDAY 22 MAY Return to Carlisle with a visit to **Broughton House** in the small coastal fishing town of **Kirkcudbright**. Arrive Carlisle by 1 pm.



Spectacular scenery, wonderful heritage and the superb coastline are all part of this North Wales tour. Stay for four nights on the Promenade overlooking the beautiful Bay of Llandudno at the St George's Hotel, where traditional Victorian elegance combines with a stunning location. The itinerary will include:

The Welsh Highland Railway, a steam-hauled narrow gauge railway, 25 miles through the heart of the magnificent Snowdonia National Park - Caernarfon to Porthmadog. From here the Ffestiniog Railway travels a further 13 miles to Blaenau Ffestiniog, the slate quarrying town for which the railway was originally built.

Bodnant Garden is a spectacular garden with grand ponds, impressive terraces and awe-inspiring plant collections rising above the River Conwy. Plas Newydd, on the shores of the Menai Strait, Lord Anglesey's elegant home with its 1930s interiors and Rex Whistler's paintings. Also near the Menai Bridge the hidden gardens of Plas Cadnant, recently lovingly restored to former glory.

A private tour of Penrhyn Castle, an extravagant fantasy castle, built for the wealthy Pennant family on the profits of Welsh slate and Jamaican sugar, housing one of the finest art collections in Wales. On a smaller scale in the Conwy Valley, Gwydir Castle with a listed garden is a fine example of a Tudor courtyard house incorporating medieval material from a former abbey; again a remarkable tale of the owner's quest to restore a Welsh castle to its original, authentic grandeur. A visit to the walled town of Conwy and a chance to explore the dark stoned fortress Conwy Castle, built by Edward I as one of the 'iron ring' of castles to contain the Welsh.




