**FRIDAY 13 MARCH** Check into The Cavendish Hotel, St James's. Your rooms should be ready by 3 pm. Meet in reception at 3.30 for the ten minute walk to Albemarle Street for a tour of **The Royal Institution Collections and Heritage Department**. Led by an expert member of the department, tours cover elements of the history and architecture of the building as well as telling the stories behind some of the **Faraday Museum** displays and various aspects of the Royal Institution's activities, past and present. If available you will see the historic lecture theatre where the Christmas Lectures are recorded.

The evening concert - **Brandenburg Festival Chorus** and **Brandenburg Sinfonia** performing Mozart's **Requiem by Candlelight** in **St Martin in the Fields**. (Programme also includes: Mozart – *Salzburg Symphony No 1, Marriage of Figaro Divertimento* and Barber – *Adagio for Strings*).

**SATURDAY 14 MARCH** A morning visit to **Shakespeare's Globe Theatre** for a guided tour of the auditorium. The expert guides vividly recreate the stories of the 1599 Globe and the reconstruction process in the 1990s, followed by a demonstration on a recreated 17th century printing press the method used for printing Shakespeare's plays. A transfer by coach over the Thames to **Two Temple Place**, known for many years as Astor House and one of London's architectural gems.

Departing from Crown Pier this unique riverside tour offers a fresh perspective on London's emerging and established skyline and a glimpse into the past, whilst looking at iconic landmarks that make London so architecturally diverse. Led by a specialist guide whose in-depth knowledge guarantees a deep insight and fascinating commentary. The 2 ½ hour tour first ventures upriver to Nine Elms, taking in Battersea Power

Station, the new American Embassy and the studio of Norman Foster, designer of the Gherkin and the Millennium Bridge. Then heading downriver Portcullis House, Somerset House and Renzo Piano's Shard, The boat has excellent viewing both on deck and below and only booked for capacity for the inside covered deck in case of rain. \*Please note: The intention is for Thames Central tour but a proviso it may go East as tides dependent – equally very interesting.

**SUNDAY 15 MARCH** Check of the hotel before a morning tour of **Spencer House**. Recognised as one of the most ambitious aristocratic town houses ever built in London and is the city's only great eighteenth-century private palace to survive intact. This magnificent aristocratic palace has regained the full splendour of its late eighteenth-century appearance after a painstaking ten-year restoration undertaken by RIT Capital Partners plc, under the Chairmanship of Lord Rothschild.

The Proms started in 1895 and a Proms Scene will include music from the era which remains a part of our national heritage today.
